## **Guest Speakers**



#### Carly Fiorina Chair of The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation

Carly has served on the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation's board of trustees since 2017 and in 2020, she was elected the Chair. Carly has extensive experience in both the corporate and nonprofit worlds. Beginning her business career as a receptionist in a nine-person real-estate firm, she would rise to become the first woman to lead a Fortune 50 company when she was appointed the chairman and CEO of Hewlett-Packard in 1999. Leading through the worst technology recession in 25 years, 9/11, as well as SARS, she led HP to become the 11th-largest company in the U.S. and among the world's leading innovators.

In addition to being a business leader, Carly is a philanthropist who has made significant contributions to the social sector throughout her career. In 2007, Carly founded the One Woman Initiative, a non-profit organization that aims to empower women around the world through access to education, healthcare, and economic opportunities. Carly has also served on the board of directors for a number of non-profit organizations, including Good360, which connects corporations with non-profits to facilitate donations of goods and services, and Opportunity International, which provides microfinance services to people in poverty around the world.

In 2017, Carly founded the Unlocking Potential Foundation with a mission to build the leadership capacity of non-profit organizations and their teams by providing those leaders with the tools and resources to strengthen their problem-solving skills. Most recently, Carly established the public charity, Pathway to Promise. Pathway to Promise connects justice-involved youth with the caring adults and community-based services they need to positively impact their daily lives, sense of possibility, and perspective about their own future so they can change their world.

## **Guest Speakers**

#### Pulitzer Prize-winning author & historian Stacy Schiff

Schiff is the author of *The Witches: Salem, 1692*, which the *New York Times* hailed as "an almost novelistic, thriller-like narrative." Schiff's previous book, *Cleopatra: A Life*, was published to great acclaim in 2010. Writing in *The Wall Street Journal*, Brad Gooch has called her "perhaps the most seductive writer of nonfiction prose in America in our time." *Cleopatra* appeared on most year-end best books lists, including the *New York Times'* Top Ten Books of 2010, and won the PEN/Jacqueline Bograd Weld Award for biography. Also a #1 bestseller, *Cleopatra* was translated into 30 languages.



Schiff is also the author of *Véra (Mrs. Vladimir Nabokov)*, winner of the Pulitzer Prize; *Saint-Exupéry*, a Pulitzer Prize finalist; and *A Great Improvisation: Franklin, France, and the Birth of America*, winner of the George Washington Book Prize, the Ambassador Award in American Studies, and the Gilbert Chinard Prize of the Institut Français d'Amérique. All three were *New York Times* Notable Books; the *Los Angeles Times* Book Review, the *Chicago Tribune*, and *The Economist* also named *A Great Improvisation* a Best Book of the Year. Michael Douglas is set to star in an Apple TV series based on *A Great Improvisation*, to be written by Emmy Award-winner Kirk Ellis and directed by Emmy-award winner Tim Van Patten. Schiff has provided on-camera commentary for various documentaries, including Ken Burns' *Benjamin Franklin*. Hailed as a "tour de force," her most recent book, *The Revolutionary: Samuel Adams*, was named one of *The Wall Street Journal's* Best 10 Books of 2022 and also figured on President Obama's list of Best 10 Books of 2022.

Schiff has received fellowships from the Guggenheim Foundation and the National Endowment for the Humanities and was a Director's Fellow at the Cullman Center for Scholars and Writers at the New York Public Library. Among other honors, she was named a 2011 Library Lion by the New York Public Library, a Boston Public Library Literary Light in 2016, and in 2017 received the Lifetime Achievement Award in History and Biography from the New England Historic Genealogical Society. She received the 2019 Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award. In 2018 she was named a Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres by the French Ministry of Culture. Awarded a 2006 Academy Award in Literature from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, she was inducted into the Academy in 2019. Schiff has written for *The New Yorker, New York Times, The Washington Post, The New York Review of Books, The Times Literary Supplement*, and *Los Angeles Times*, among many other publications. She lives in New York City.

#### **Guest Speakers**



#### **Bill Whitaker**

Whitaker has covered major news stories domestically and across the globe for CBS News over four decades. He is the 2018 winner of the RTDNA's highest honor, the Paul White Award for career achievement. He was named a 60 Minutes correspondent in March 2014; the 2022-23 season is his ninth on the broadcast. Whitaker's 60 Minutes reporting has taken him to Asia, Africa, Europe, Mexico and the Middle East in his four seasons, including a timely investigation of the vetting process Syrian refugees undergo before coming to the U.S. and an interview with the highest-ranking North Korean official to defect in decades.

Before joining 60 Minutes, Whitaker covered virtually all of the major news stories in the West since he was posted to Los Angeles in 1992, reporting regularly for the CBS Evening News and other CBS News broadcasts. He also has worked for Sunday Morning, turning out feature stories and thoughtful profiles, including on Barbra Streisand, Norman Lear and Gladys Knight. One of his most memorable Sunday Morning profiles was of ex-boxer Mike Tyson. He has interviewed First Lady Michelle Obama and Mexican President Enrique Pena Nieto.

Whitaker frequently reported from overseas as well, covering the funeral of Nelson Mandela from South Africa. He also did pieces from Japan on the Fukushima nuclear disaster and from Haiti after the tragic earthquake there. He reported from Kabul during the early stages of the war in Afghanistan.

In 2008, he covered Mitt Romney's presidential campaign. He was CBS News' lead reporter on the 2000 presidential campaign of George W. Bush. Prior to his assignment to Los Angeles, Whitaker served as CBS News' Tokyo correspondent (1989-92). There, he covered stories throughout Asia, including the pro-democracy uprising in Tiananmen Square, military coup attempts in the Philippines and the enthronement of Japan's Emperor Akihito. He was in Baghdad for the build-up to Desert Storm


Before that, Whitaker was based in Atlanta (1985-88), where he won an Emmy for his reports on the collapse of Jim and Tammy Bakker's television ministry and covered the 1988 presidential campaign of Michael Dukakis. Whitaker joined CBS News as a reporter in November 1984. Whitaker was born in Philadelphia on August 26, 1951; he was graduated from Hobart and William Smith Colleges with a B.A. degree in American history and from Boston University with a master's degree in African-American studies. Whitaker also holds a master's degree in journalism from the University of California, Berkeley. He was awarded an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from Hobart and William Smith Colleges in 1997.

#### **About VA250**

Established by the General Assembly in 2020, the **Virginia American Revolution 250 Commission (VA250)** serves to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, the Revolutionary War, and the independence of the United States in the Commonwealth of Virginia, one of the former colonies and future states, where much of this history took place.

Virginia's history is America's story: complex, diverse, and promising. It is a multicultural story that in the Revolutionary era was Native American, European, African and American, both Patriot and Loyalist. Focusing on Revolutionary events in 1775 and 1776, the Virginia semiquincentennial will embrace this inclusive history that marked the origins of a revolutionary new nation.

A primary goal of the Commission is to convene and facilitate a Commonwealth-wide commemoration and celebration, multi-faceted and inclusive of hundreds of partners and representatives of the wide array of histories, sites, stories, and communities that define Virginia.
