# Summer 2024: VH-VA250 Grant Recommendations (Round 2)

### Recommended for full funding

1) Afro American Historical Association of Fauquier County (AAHA)

• **Program name**: "Delivering the untold story of Fauquier's African American population at America's founding"

• VA250 Local Committee – Fauguier County

• **Amount of award**: \$10,000

• Amount of match from recipient: \$10,000

Number of partners: 2

**Description**: The Afro American Historical Association of Fauquier County (AAHA) seeks \$10,000 to support the research phase of a 3-part endeavor entitled, "Delivering the Untold Story of Fauquier's African American Population at America's Founding." This project proposes to unveil and deliver the history of Fauquier's African Americans, 1759-1790. Funding will support research that will focus on the years beginning with Fauquier's formation in 1759-1790.

#### 2) Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities DBA Preservation Virginia

• Program name: New Exhibition Gallery at Patrick Henry's Scotchtown: Contradictions of Liberty

• Amount of match from recipient: \$72,500

**Description**: Preservation Virginia seeks \$10,000 to support the installation of a new exhibit at Scotchtown that will explore Patrick Henry's role in the nation's founding. The new exhibition will replace the content currently on display that has been in place for almost a decade. It will highlight the period from 1771 to 1778 when the Henrys lived at Scotchtown and will include new research by the Preservation Virginia team and newly obtained artifacts in their collection. This new interpretive material will be an essential part of the larger restoration plan at Scotchtown in preparation for VA250.

#### 3) Botetourt County Historical Society, Inc.

- Program name: Celebrating & Remembering the 250th Anniversary of the Battle of Point Pleasant

**Description**: The Botetourt County Historical Society in Fincastle, VA seeks \$6,500 to support the presentation of the Battle of Point Pleasant to the public through a talk by Dr. Sarah McCartney. This event will mark the 250th anniversary of the battle, which was the only major armed conflict of what is known as Dunmore's War (a precursor to the American Revolution). Funds will specifically go towards event promotion and the production of education materials to be displayed at the Botetourt County Museum of History and Culture.

#### 4) Clarke County Historical Association

**Description**: The Clarke County Historical Association seeks \$1,700 to support Clarke County's 13th Annual Heritage Day. This event, hosted at the historic Burwell-Morgan Mill, brings in over two dozen history organizations and historic craft makers to provide a family-friendly experience as they learn about every day life in Virginia during the Revolutionary War. Activities such as cider pressing, grain grinding, blacksmithing, Colonial cooking, scavenger hunts, and more are held all day for people of all ages to experience. This event is free and open to the public.

#### 5) Culpeper Minute Men

- Program name: Pre-Event Community Engagment for the Bicentennial of Lafayette's Visit to Culpeper

**Description**: The Culpeper Minute Men seek \$10,000 to support a series of classes and workshops for the public with a focus on humanities, arts, and culture that will appeal to a broad audience and tie to the VA250 themes. These events will recall the Town and the citizens of Culpeper as they were during the Revolutionary War period, at the successful conclusion of the war in 1825, as they were when they celebrated the Centennial visit in 1925, and as they are today. Classes and workshops will educate the public on the fashion and dance of the period.

#### 6) Fairfield Foundation

• Program name: From Colony to Country: The Revolutionary World of John Page and Lewis Burwell

**Description**: The Fairfield Foundation in White Marsh, VA seeks \$5,350 to support the development of a Revolutionary-period first-person interpretation program in collaboration with Shades of Our Past (https://www.shadesofourpast.com). It will be offered three times during 2025 and will be centered on two Virginians—John Page and Lewis Burwell—who played important roles in the shift from royal colony to independent nation. Other interpreters will portray children, wives, and enslaved people and interject comments about the significance of the Revolution to them. A concluding conversation will allow the public to engage with the dialogue of the program.

#### 7) Fauquier Historical Society

• Program name: A Lafayette Legacy: Honoring the Anniversary of a Revolutionary Icon's Visit to Warrenton, VA

**Description**: The Fauquier Historical Society seeks \$6,000 to support the planning, design and development of a new exhibit commemorating Lafayette and his historic visit to Warrenton. The exhibit will showcase various relics associated with Lafayette and will highlight the role Lafayette played in America's independence as well as convey how his legacy can inspire future generations. The museum aims to reach a diverse audience through this exhibit, from students to history enthusiasts who have a particular passion for Revolutionary War history and to the wider public.

#### 8) Foundation for Historic Christ Church

The series features three nationally acclaimed historians who explore the lives of George Washington, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson and the roles they played in the Revolution and the creation of the American republic. Funding would specifically support speaker honoraria, travel and lodging costs, and marketing expenses.

#### 9) Historical Society of Western Virginia

**Description**: The Historical Society of Western Virginia seeks \$10,000 to support programming surrounding 18th century life on the frontier and in the Appalachian Mountains, in conjunction with their "Fincastle Resolutions and Native Perspectives" exhibition which celebrates the Western side of the state's involvement in the American Revolution. Several different types of programming (artisan workshops, foodways lectures, living history days, etc) will occur throughout the duration of the exhibition, which opens January 18, 2025, and will run until August of 2025. These programs will foster curiosity on diverse perspectives and ways of life, engage families, and create research opportunities for interpreters.

#### 10) Jamestown Rediscovery Foundation

The proposed project, "Jamestown and the American Revolution," will directly address the overarching goals identified by the VA 250 Commission: "to educate Virginians about our history and our founding ideals," and "to engage every community and all regions in events that tell a complete story." Funds will support the development of new programs that will focus on the crucial connections between the colony's 17th-century history, the unfolding of the American Revolution in Virginia, and the ongoing debates around democracy and justice in our present moment.

**Description**: The National Trust for Historic Preservation in the United States seeks \$10,000 to support "Finding Freedom in a Time of Independence"—a three-part series taking place in 2024-2025. This program will invite three distinguished speakers and historians to share their work and engage in discussion around topics related to how Native American and African American people navigated their pursuit of freedom during the period around the Revolutionary War. Funding will support honoraria and travel expenses for speakers and videography expenses to record sessions and reach a wider virtual audience.

Funding will support honoraria for presenters, travel expenses, and related program expenses.

Funding specifically will support the wages of living history interpreters who will present these key historical figures to the public.

18th century. Through in-person panel discussions and digital distribution of materials, the RHF hopes to increase the public's interaction with the museum.

A large-scale, participatory cultural experience, the Puzzle Hunt integrates music, humanities, and media arts into a series of complex puzzles integrated into the urban landscape. The 4th annual Puzzle Hunt will be hosted on March 15, 2025 and will celebrate America's Semiquincentennial by featuring images, stories, and/or character reenactments of actual historical figures from the American Revolution on each of the puzzle pieces.

This initiative seeks the distribution of historical plaques embedded with QR codes to serve as physical gateways to a wealth of historical insights through a dedicated mobile application for IOS and Android devices. With plaques placed across significant locations, Abingdon transforms into a living museum inviting individuals to embark on a journey into the past to learn about the Town's Revolutionary War heritage.

The exhibits will be developed for display at the Watermen's Museum with components designed to be used as traveling exhibits for use at regional 250th anniversary focused events to include the 250th anniversary of the Yorktown Tea Party in November 2024, and the 250th Anniversary of the Lord Dunmore Virginia Campaign in June 2025.
