



Summary:

This media moment depicts the way ordinary people, through discourse and the power of print, ignited the flames of a revolutionary movement.

In a modest tavern in a Virginia town, a small printing press publishes pamphlets while townspeople gather upstairs to discuss revolutionary ideas. Historical headlines and pamphlet titles of the time begin cascading over the scene, eventually becoming flames as their revolutionary ideas sweep throt colonial Virginia.


